

the conclusion of the last two division meetings Lorrie and I have done a hands on "make and take" clinic. In this clinic we've been working on building an oil storage tank with a pump house along side it (see photo below). When



This is where the paperwork can be a little easier to fill out. EXAMPLE: After you fill out the paperwork for your first kit build, use it to help you write the next kit build and then the



complete, your mini diorama will also have some scenery and a working light/electric pole. If you're working on your MMR, this simple structure can be submitted for grading. If this scratchbuilt structure that you're making in the clinic can score a total of 87.5 points or more, you're on your way to an MMR STRUCTURE AP with one structure down.

For Lorrie and myself and our journey in going for our Master Model Railroader Certificates, the Structure AP will be the first one that we'll go after. We already have dozens and dozens of structures to choose from. What we need to do next is to pick six scratch built structures and 6 kit builds.

next one until you have write ups for all six structures. Chances are, you used some of the same techniques for every build. Campbell shingles, Alcohol and India Ink washes, weathering powders, gluing walls together, sanding, windows, adding lights (inside and out). You get the idea, cut & paste

when applicable. This saves time!

Keep in mind that your scratchbuilt structures don't have to be huge. Small simple structures will work just fine. Lorrie and I hope to finish up the oil tank and pump house with one and maybe two more work sessions.



After we're done with the oil tank and pump house, you'll be finished with us until next year when we build a water tank. The water tanks we will be building may be used to service backwoods trains or you can use them for the roof tops on industrial structures or



apartment buildings. I promise, you will love these little water tanks just as we do. Lorrie and I have 7-8 of these water tanks on our layout and get compliments on them often!






Frisco in Fort Worth Part III

The purpose of this series of articles is to describe **Frisco** activities in Fort Worth in the late 1950's and early 1960's. The series will include articles about **Frisco** freight operations including switching boundaries, customers, interchanges, freight forwarding, industrial districts, yards, team tracks, warehouses, grain elevators, freight house, etc.

This month we'll take a look at the **interchanges** used by the Frisco in the Fort Worth area.

Texas and Pacific. The T&P delivers cars to the Frisco on an interchange track area **B** see Figure 3.1 T&P Interchange that is located in the City Yard on West Vickery. The Frisco delivers cars to the T&P inter change track in their yard in area **L** adjacent to the T&P Passenger Station on East Lancaster Street see Figure 3.1 T&P Interchange.





Fort Worth and Denver. Deliveries to and receipts from the FW&D are handled on an interchange track area **H** located in North Fort Worth see Figure 3.5 FWD Interchange.




Figure 3.4 T&NO Interchange




Figure 3.8 FWB Interchange
