

The division will be supplying all the materials for everyone to enjoy this clinic. I hope everyone will take advantage of this opportunity and attend our clinic to learn new techniques for modeling.


#### **Clinic Overview**

Make-N-Take Light Poles by Leo & Lorrie Palitti

This month's program will feature a clinic conducted by Leo and Lorrie Palitti on building a budget friendly light pole.

Leo and Lorrie developed this technique couple of years ago when they were installing Walther's street lights on front of a just finished structure for our layout. These lights look great but the downside is the 5/16" hole needed for each pole. After a little trial and error, Lorrie and I came up with something we both like. For our light pole clinic we will demonstrate how to make a nice looking light pole that's also budget friendly.
