Clinic Overview Cowcatcher Division Program for June 8, 2019

#### Part 3 - Class A Depot Kit Construction

The June 8<sup>th</sup> program will continue with part 3 of the make-n-take depot clinic with MMR Duane Richardson. Before beginning the next session, all home work will need to be completed. In review, the homework assignment is;

- All four walls of the depot be connected.
- Install all windows (including circular windows) and four doors (2 freight, 2 man), door and window frames and trim
- Color the engraved sides of the roof black (do not paint, use a magic marker, sharpie, etc.)
- Paint the overhang portion of the underside of the roof the same color as the walls. (Weigh down after painting to avoid warping)
- Attach a piece of square strip wood, between the peaks of the two side walls to create a roof ridge support. Remember to install at an angle at the same pitch of the roof line, creating an upside-down V.
- Stain the outdoor portion of the floor piece / porch
- For the June meeting, remember to bring;
  - o a course, 100 grit Emory Board
  - o paint for the roof shingles
  - strip wood, like the piece for the roof support, that will used to glue the building to the base

The June 8<sup>th</sup> program will include preparing and installing the bay window, installing the roof braces and placing shingles on the roof with the goal of final completion of the depot.

### The Dining Car

#### Old Fashioned Navy Bean Soup, Rio Grande Style

With the last month of cooler weather left before the onslaught of summer, I thought a good old fashioned bean soup recipe might be in order. this month we feature old fashioned navy bean soup, Rio Grande style:

Ingredients

- 3 cups of navy beans in cold water to cover
- 4 Tablespoons of flour
- 2 medium onions, minced
- 4 quarts beef stock
- 2 medium carrots, diced
- 3 large tomatoes, peeled and diced
- 1/4 cup bacon drippings -pork, turkey or duck bacon
- Salt and pepper to taste

(This recipe tastes good because of all the ingredients that are bad for you. You can substitute olive oil for the bacon drippings and bouillon for the stock, but it won't be as tasty. Since you don't eat like this all the time, it's probably okay to go ahead and use the ingredients as stated. You can also add ham bones or ham to improve the flavor if you don't use bacon drippings.)

#### Instructions

In a large pot, cover the beans with cold water and soak overnight. This is an important step, don't skip it. The next day, don't drain the soaking water and bring the beans and water to boil. Reduce the heat to low and simmer. Peel and chop tomatoes, set aside. (You can substitute using chopped canned tomatoes). Next make the rue - in a large sauce pan melt the bacon drippings and braise the onions and carrots over medium heat until translucent and tender. Stirring constantly, add the flour to absorb the bacon drippings (make sure there are no lumps). Add the beef stock and tomatoes, stirring until the rue is dissolved and the mixture is heated thoroughly. Add the mixture, salt, and pepper to the beans and stock. Cook on simmer for about one and half hours or until the beans are tender. Just before serving, you can add ham for flavor. Serve with biscuits or cornbread, close your eyes, and imagine your gently rocking back and forth on a Rio Grande dining car... Enjoy,
