### **Clinic Overview**

Cowcatcher Division Program for May 11, 2019

The May program will include a presentation by guest speaker Mike Armstrong, discussing his 30' x 40' layout of the Rock Island Railroad, spanning from St. Paul, MN to Kansas City, KS. Mike will discuss how this 100% complete, extremely detailed, two-level, HO layout came to be featured in the March 2019 issue of Model Railroader magazine.

After the Cowcatcher meeting, Mike has invited everyone to an open house to visit his layout. His address in Keller, TX will be provided at the May meeting. Everyone is encouraged to see his amazing layout.

The May clinic will continue the Make-N-Take Class A Depot with Duane Richardson, MMR. Before proceeding with the May clinic, all participants will need to complete their homework from the April clinic

- remove the punch-outs from the remaining two walls
- paint the two walls
- attach the walls to the other walls that have already been completed.
- punch out the window opens of the bay window
- paint the bay window walls (only paint the edges inside the windows)
- paint the roof braces in the trim color. Paint the freight and people door backs from the same carrier sheet the same color as the walls.

Dry brush all of the parts on the carrier sheets listed below with the trim color. Do not over-paint as this may make it difficult to remove the parts from the carrier sheets at the May meeting, just paint lightly until you get the desired finish. Do not remove the pieces from the carrier sheets, but if they do fall out consider placing parts from each sheet into a separate labeled envelope to make it easier to locate them during the May clinic. Carrier sheets to be painted in trim color;

- Freight Doors carrier sheet
- Windows sheet carrier
- Bay Window carrier sheet
- Exterior Doors carrier sheet End Windows carrier sheets
- Exterior Window Trim carrier sheet

The May clinic will include preparing and installing the bay window walls, and installing the trim, doors, and windows. Remember to bring the same tools and materials as last month for the May clinic.



### Tips & Tricks By Leo Palitti

### **Tissue Paper Signs**

I have read many an article on how to put signs on brick buildings and clapboard siding. First you need a picture of a sign you like, cut it out from a magazine or book and then sand the back of it so you can almost see through it (easier said than done). I've done it many times. It takes a long time to sand paper down to get it thin enough if you don't rip it first, who knew paper was so hard to sand down? Using tissue paper works almost like a real decal paper, that's how thin it is. This is my first attempt at using tissue paper after hearing about it from a friend.

Pick a sign and get your tissue paper (the white stuff that's usually used for gifts), this paper has a shiny side and a dull side. Cut out a piece of tissue paper a little bigger than your printed sign and tape the tissue paper shiny down over the sign you just printed. I used Scotch Magic tape to hold the sign in place. Now reload your paper back in the tray and reprint your sign. This time it will print out onto your tissue paper. I used an HP inject printer for my signs. You will have to set the ink in the paper to keep it from running when it gets wet from the glue so I sprayed 2 or 3 good coats of Grumbacher's fixative to set the ink in the paper (Testers DullCote will work fine). I tacked the signs to foam core board to keep them from blowing away. It's best to wait 20-30 minutes between coats and spray both sides of the signs! I only sprayed the front of the RC Cola sign and there was some running (see pics) but the running colors made the sign look old and after some weathering we'd probably never know the difference. If the colors didn't run I could have worked the sign into the boards a little better. Cut out your signs with sharp scissors, or a sharp hobby knife can also be used but be careful or it will tear on you.



thinned it down with a <u>very</u> little water. Use a small

paintbrush and apply a little glue on your building where the sign is to be placed. Affix one corner of the sign in place so you can square it up with the building. You only have one chance at this so be careful.

Once you have it lined up and in place, lift the rest of the sign up and apply small amounts of glue with a paint brush. Use the paint brush to smooth out the top part of the sign. Now roll it down carefully from the set side and use a folded paper towel to work out any air bubbles plus working it down into the clapboards or the brick. You can use a little glue on top to help set it, do not pick at it to much just let it dry. The white glue should dry dull, if it's shiny just give it a little shot of Dullcote. When possible it is easier to apply your signs first before assembling the wall that make up your building because you can do so on a flat surface. This technique will work great on almost any kind of signs and or billboards.

This was followed by the first of three construction workshops on building a station presented by Duane Richardson.

## The Dining Car

#### **Buttermilk Pancakes**

This month's Dining Car feature is a breakfast recipe for buttermilk pancakes from the Texas and Pacific Railway. If you haven't tasted these, you've missed a real treat. The origin of this recipe is the Texas and Pacific Railway dining car. Enjoy!

This menu item was requested more than any other on the Texas and Pacific. It is simple, but has a fantastic taste. The recipe should make a batch of twelve six inch pancakes and it takes about a half hour to prepare.

#### Ingredients


- 2 eggs
- 1 1/4 cups buttermilk
- ½ tsp salt
- 2 tsp baking power
- 1/4 tsp baking soda
- 2 Tbsp bacon fat, melted
- 2 Tbsp sugar
- 1 1/4 cups flour

In a medium sized mixing bowl, beat the eggs thoroughly. Blend in order: buttermilk, salt, baking powder, baking soda, fat, and sugar. Whip until well mixed. Fold in the flour, but only stir it enough to remove lumps. Lightly grease a griddle or large pan, then heat it on medium-high. When a drop of water sizzles, the griddle is ready. Pour the batter into six inch pancakes, turning once, until lightly browned and cooked through.


