## Clinic Overview Mail Trains

Reminder: The October meeting of the Cowcatcher Division will take place on the **FIRST Saturday** of the month, on October  $5^{th}$ , at the Forest Hill Convention & Civic Center.

The October clinic will be presented by Jim Ogden. Jim has been modeling since childhood, with a special interest in prototype operations and detailing cars. His favorite roads are the Missouri Pacific and Texas Pacific, although he also enjoys his interest in other lines such as the Katy and Illinois Central. Jim has had several articles published in Model Railroader Magazine. Jim always appreciates the exchange of model railroading information to help enhance his knowledge and skills in the hobby.

Jim's presentation will be on Mail Trains, which from the 1890's to 1960's carried the vast majority of the mail for the United States Postal Service, and often provided the necessary revenue to keep passenger lines operating. Jim will discuss dedicated mail trains, as well as the Railway Post Office (RPO) which were cars included with passenger service which sorted mail in route to speed up the delivery of the mail. Jim will help to explain why mail cars were off limits to passengers and why postal clerks wore firearms to help protect their precious and sometimes secret cargo.

Mike Mackey, Division President, opened the meeting with recognition of guests.

He then noted that the Division share of the LSR conference came to \$2219. Bringing the Division treasury to approximately \$5300. That total is after the purchase of the Division projector and camera. A microphone is still needed to record Division activities for approximately \$250. This was approved by the membership.

Next, he noted a schedule change for the October meeting from the second Saturday to the first Saturday (Oct. 5th) due to the Plano Train Show.

He then noted that the October meeting will host Jim Ogden who will make a presentation on Mail Trains. Jim previously had an article in Model Railroader – Pike Size Passenger Trains.

November meeting will be a presentation on the Rocky Mountaineer by travelers John Garfield, Frank Treadaway, Ken Kaiser, Jay Waters and his son.

Mike noted that the Plano Train Show in October is the responsibility of the Division as it replaces the Fort Worth Train Show. A sign-up sheet for volunteers to work the NMRA/Division 1 & 3 booth are needed along with volunteers to do presentations at the show. Three time slots are open and needed for presentations at the show. Contact show coordinator Ken Kaiser.

Mike noted that he received an email from Ray Deblick that a contract for the 2023 National NMRA Convention was ready to process. Noting that the Narrow Guage Convention in California was charging \$199 a night for rooms, our agreement is only \$175.

AP Certificates were presented to Frank Treadaway for his Golden Spike, and Michael Ross received two certificates one for Electrical and one for Association Volunteer.

Noting that t-shirts, short sleeve shirts and long sleeve shirts with the Division Logo and name were available through the Division Web Site, Mike pointed out several members with Division shirts on.

Show and Tell featured two presentations. One on a farm scene building and one discussion of two types of brick mortar displays being selected. Michael Ross noted a trestle jig and several members noted both home made and commercial jigs available.

A presentation was then made by Mike Brannan on building trestles.

There being no other business, the meeting adjourned at 11:00 AM

ack to the AP program. As Lorrie and I write these articles every month, we're also working on our AP's. The write ups / paperwork involved with these

awards can be quite tiresome but they are very important and needed. We're to the point that we have all our rolling stock built, 4 kit builds and 4 scratch builds each but by putting off our write ups, we've made it difficult on ourselves trying to remember what we did while constructing our cars. All of Lorries scratch builds were all less than 2 years ago, some of my scratch building goes back 25+ years. In the early 1990's there was a hobby shop that went out of business in Haltom City on 28th Street. I bought handfuls of scratch building supplies and kits from that hobby shop and still have lots of those supplies and kits today. I found it fun to build a car or two in between building structures for The Texas Western Model Railroad Club. After Lorrie started building structures in 2006, I encouraged her to build an HOn3 car kit. She chose the Tiffany boxcar by Binkley Models.





She thought the Tiffany car was cute and she's right, it is kind of cute (it's on our layout). Most of these cars are a joy to build and give the builder a sense of accomplishment in just a short time.

All this sounds great right? Well, the problem that I (we) have come across is doing the write ups for these cars long after they were built. It's not easy trying to remember what the heck we did a year ago or twenty years ago? I can look at the underframes and remember that the doohickey is connected to the thingy and later it was painted some shade of brown. Taking photos of our work last century wasn't nearly as easy as it is today. When you have notes and pictures to use as a reference, it makes doing your AP write ups a breeze! The AP program is a great way for us modelers to learn. What I learned in all of this is that taking notes and pictures while working on your AP's is a

good idea. 👍



## Open-faced Hot Mexican Sandwich

The dog days of summer are nearly over, but we've got a nice meal treat for those cooler days when the temperature drops below 100F: Grilled Mexican Sandwich, Santa Fe style and Mexican coleslaw from the Chesapeake & Ohio Railway:Open-fad Hot

## Mexican Sandwich from the Chesapeake & Ohio Railway

### **Ingredients:**

- 1 lb. browned hamburger or diced roast beef
- 1/4 lb. Swiss or Colby cheese, grated
- 4 hard-boiled eggs, chopped fine
- ½ cup mayonnaise
- 4 green chilies diced fine (I used canned or fresh)
- 1 tsp. lemon juice
- ½ cup pimentos, diced fine
- ½ cup chili or picante sauce
- 1 celery stalk, diced fine
- 8 drops of Tabasco or Louisiana hot sauce

#### **Instructions:**

Warm or lightly toast the bread in a toaster. Place the meat, hard-boiled eggs, green chilies, pimento, celery, and cheese into a bowl. Next add mayonnaise, lemon juice, picante (or chili) sauce, and hot sauce and mix thoroughly. Spread on bread slices. Place on baking sheet and grill five inches from the broiler. Toast until the topping is lightly browned and bubbly. Cut slices diagonally and serve with coal slaw.

## Mexican coleslaw from the Chesapeake & Ohio Railway

### **Ingredients:**

- 1 medium head cabbage
- 1 medium onion, chopped fine
- 2 small green peppers
- 2 Tbsp. parsley, chopped
- 2/3 cup mayonnaise
- salt and pepper to taste
- 1 oz. white vinegar
- 16 strips pimento

#### **Instructions:**

Quarter the cabbage head, remove the core and shred or grate very fine. Quarter the green peppers, remove seeds, and shred or grate fine. Combine cabbage and green pepper. Add mayonnaise, vinegar, onion, salt, pepper, and chopped parsley. Mix thoroughly and chill. Serve a scoop on a leaf of lettuce. Garnish with pimento strips. Well, that's it. These recipes are very old, but they're easy to update with tostado instead of bread, and other southwestern spices.


