AP Flyer

his month I would like to talk about paints. I've always been a "crafty" person making things big and small to decorate in and around the house. When I became a model railroader fourteen years ago I was excited to learn this new hobby

along with using new tools, glue and paint to build/create models and do scenery. When we married, Leo had dozens of cans of "hobby" paint by Floquil and Testors. These little cans came in railroad colors, Pullman Green, Depot Buff, Reefer White, Rail Brown to name a few. It seemed crazy to spend \$6-\$8 for a very small can of spray paint when I could get something quite similar at Hobby Lobby for \$3-\$4 and get four times the paint with my purchase. Whenever we need a spray paint for a project, I go to Hobby Lobby and find a similar color in a spray can and it's always cheaper than hobby paint and does the same job. A lot of these spray cans will leave a shine after it's applied so I use Dull-Cote to tone that shine down. Dull-Cote is a must have for every modeler. Try to avoid gloss colors.

While strolling the aisles of Home Depot about 7 years ago, I came across a new line of paint from Rustoleum called "Camouflage" paint. These paints are really nice because they are all "flat" colors, no shine at all. We started painting the track on our layout with Floquils Rail Brown and ran out of paint 60% of the way through.



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Floquil went out of business so we had to find another paint source to finish painting our track. The Rustoleum Camouflage "Earth Brown" is a great substitute. These days we have all the camouflage colors on hand. Whenever starting a new kit, I take all the detail parts out and give them a coating of Camouflage "Sand". This coat works as a nice primer but it also works great as a wood color after a quick wash of Alcohol and India ink.



Now some readers may be asking "Alcohol and India ink"? That's a trick I was taught when I first got started building models. My understanding is this is something that was formulated by George Sellios of Fine Scale Miniature models decades ago. By brushing detail parts and just about anything with this A&I stain, it highlights the details to make them easier to see with your eyes.

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From The Dining Car

Flaked Breast of Chicken Frisco Style

This month's recipe hales from the kitchens on the Frisco dining cars. It is a tasty treat for those cool spring days.

Ingredients

- 5 lb. roasting chicken, cooked
- 1 pt light cream
- 4 Tbsp butter salt to taste
- 6 medium mushrooms, sliced thick
- 1/4 tsp cayenne pepper
- 2 small green peppers, julienned
- 4 egg yolks, beaten
- 2 lbs sweetbreads, precooked and diced
- 1/2 cup light cream, warmed
- 2 pimentos, julienned
- 4 Tbsp dry sherry
- 1 Tbsp flour

Preparation

You'll need a four quart saucepan and small mixing bowl. This recipe takes an hour to prepare and should yield

about 12 servings. Remove cooked chicken from the bone, discard skin, shred meat coarsely, and set aside. In the saucepan over medium heat, melt butter and sauté mushrooms and green peppers until tender. Add chicken, sweetbreads, and pimentos. Dust lightly with flour. Stir in the pint of cream salt, and cayenne. Bring just to boil. reduce heat. and simmer for several minutes. Meanwhile, beat egg yokes until they reach a lemon color, then dissolve the 1/2 cup cream. Stir egg/cream mixture into simmering ingredients to thicken. Add sherry and stir to mix. Do not return to boil after egg volks have been added or the sauce will break down. Serve hot over rice or noodles

Another way to make detail pop out to the viewer is dry brushing after you're finished. Dry brushing is a simple yet effective practice. To dry brush, just put a dab of Apple Crate antique white or gull gray onto a paper towel and then gently coat both sides of the stiff bristled brush in the paint.



Your bristles should have a small amount of pigment in the bristles. Then take the brush and wipe off most of the paint on a paper towel in a back and forth motion. Do this until your brush barely leaves behind any paint pigment. In other words, only a bit of paint should appear with each stroke on the paper towel on the raised texture.

Use light, quick strokes, to gently apply your dry brush onto your working surface. A low to zeropressure sweeping action will leave behind a small bit of pigment with each stroke. Repeat the process until you are satisfied with the result. Of course, practice on scraps first. One last thing that I would like to share is improving the looks of the vehicles we put on our layouts. Most people take the cars out of the boxes and set them on the layout. It makes it look like everyone in town is driving a new car. To get away from that I like to tone down that shine. Model-Master makes "Flat-Finish" in a bottle that works perfect for this. I take a 1/8" soft brush, dip it in the Flat-Finish and go over all the painted parts of the cars or trucks. If the bumpers are too shiny for you, hit them too. Stay away from the windows. Once dry some dirt and grime powders/chalks are much easier to apply to the vehicles.

Until next month remember; it's okay to paint outside the lines!






