Program for February 8, 2020

Program Overview

Make-and-Take Clinic Part 1 of 2 and 2 of 2 will occupy the February & March 2020 Div. 1 Meetings. Our presenter for the Scratch Building a Flatcar Clinic, Duane Richardson, MMR has been around the hobby his en-tire life, receiving his first train set as a young boy to an advanced modeler learning from many mentors who would go on to become MMR's. He joined the NMRA in the later 90's and achieved MMR status in 2007. This made his father Paul, and Duane the first Father/Son MMR's team. Duane has won numerous contest awards at local and Regional shows covering most categories in modeling and photography (including the Best of Show Awards in both modeling and photography). Duane has also won awards at the National Narrow Gauge Conventions and had his work on the cover of Sn3 modeler and the Cowcatcher Roundup. He models the Purgatory & Devil River Railroad in HOn3, which is a fictitious Colorado narrow gauge line set in the fall of 1957. Duane is a member of the North Texas Narrow Gauge Group.

Duane has taught at the Lone Star Region conventions going back to 1999 and several National Narrow Gauge Conventions and Sn3 Symposium's and has written articles for several years that have appeared in the Marker Lamp and is the only author to have articles in every issue of the HOn3 Annual.

These tools and materials or alternates are necessary to complete the flat car kit.

- Exacto knife with several sharp #11 blades.
- Cutting Mat.

 NWSL Chopper or a Razor Saw with a Miter Box. The Chopper is highly recommended as it makes multiple precision cuts much easier. Choppers are available at Discount Model Trains in Addison, TX. (provided they are not sold out) If using a Chopper, make sure to have a sharp blade installed.
 - 220-grit or higher Sand Paper. A 220-grit Sanding Sponge works really well.
 - Glue Yellow Carpenters Glue is preferred and highly recommended. Elmer's White Glue (NOT School Glue) or Aileen's Tacky Glue can also be used.
 - Glue Applicator. Can use a Toothpick, Sewing Pin, Micro-Brush, etc.
 - Shot glass is recommended but not required. Concaved bottom of shot glass allows for an area to place glue which can easily be accessed.
 - Small head Phillips and Slot screwdrivers.
 - Wire Cutters.
 - Small Pliers to bend wire.
 - Pin Vise and small Drill Bits.
 - Acrylic Paint (black, grey or boxcar red)
 - Small Paint Brush (if needed for touch-up)
 - India Ink (NOT Acrylic Ink) and a pint of 91% Alcohol. (Can use the Ink/Alcohol mix from the depot clinic). (Hobby Lobby has stocked Dr. Ph Martins India Ink.)
 - A leak proof container for mixing and storing the Ink/Alcohol.
 - Scale Ruler.
 - Paper Towels.
 - Pencil with sharp point.

Optional parts for the Flat Car are;

- Decal Set or Dry Transfers.
- Flat piece of brass or lead, especially if you want to run the car without a load. It should not be very thick but you will need some weight to help track the car correctly.
- Casting or set of castings for a load (some castings can be drilled out to add weight).

If you have registered for the Scratch Building a Flatcar Clinic and have not paid your fees, pay Treasurer Dick Brannon.

AP Flyer


"You need the right tool for the job", ever hear that before? That rings true in model railroading. Whatever you're building, a plastic kit, wood kit or scratch building, having the right tools can make a huge difference. If you've ever spent the money for a high end craftsman kit, you've seen the list of tools they suggest using as you read through the instructions. We can improvise on some of those if needed but there's nothing like having "the right tool for the job".

Over the last 30 years since I jumped into this hobby, I've amassed an amazing amount of tools, Some I needed some that I wondered why I bought Let's touch on some tools that every modeler should have (some day). All the tools mentioned are available at Micron-Mark along with the part

- **1- Pin Vise / Drill Bit Set** Item #: 81651 [\$24.95] This little pin vise comes with an assortment of drill bits. You'll also find many supplemental sets of drill bits available but they're pricey (\$25-30). You will find yourself using this drill for installing lights, attaching detail parts, building rolling stock etc.
- **2- 5-piece Mid-Size File Set** Item #: 81063 [\$14.95] These files are used for almost every project in some way. I have 5 different sets of files but I find myself using this set most often. Making most things fit together almost always takes a little filing.

- **3- 3-piece Diamond Reamer Set** Item #: 81650 [\$17.95] You may find yourself scratching your head on this one but these things will come in handy for many I have a 5 piece set of reamers from France that I've had for 20 years. Drill a hole in anything and there always seems to be something left to get in the way, Reamers are a great way to clean up and maybe slightly enlarge the hole you just drilled for accommodation.
- 4- Duplicating Jig for Cutting Strip and Tube Stock Item #: 84388 [\$28.95] I use this jig in place of a Chopper. Yes, the Chopper is great and has been around for years. My problems with the Chopper are as follows,
- a- the wearing down of the base.
- b- if chopping HO scale lumber of 8x8 or larger, the blade tends to slide and gets away from the 90 degree cut we want.
- c- cutting multiple pieces at one time is difficult.
- d- that shiny end after the blade cuts the wood.
- e- if you're cutting dozens of pieces of lumber the blade "pops" when completing each few cuts and moves the stopper so I find myself remeasuring in order to keep all pieces the same size.
- Zona Razor Saw Blade, 32 TPI Item #: 82981 [\$2.95] This goes with the cutting jig. The fine teeth (32tpi) will give you a nice 90 degree cut every time on pieces up to three inches long. Lock down the guide to the length you want and you can saw pieces for two days and each piece will be the same. The lock on the jig is metal on metal and won't slip/move.

5- 1-2-3 Blocks Item #: 84644 [\$29.95] Pricey, yes they are but on the bright side, they'll last forever. They are great to assist keeping structures square and many more uses you'll discover. These also make great weights for interior bracing.

Speaking of weights, another great source for weights is a marble/granite company that makes kitchen counter tops. they'll let you go through their scraps and try to find pieces 3" or 4" wide. Then have them cut them up into 3"x 6", 3" x 8" and 3"x 10" pieces. They'll charge \$1-2 a cut and the marble/granite will cost next to nothing. Between us, Lorrie and I have 11 pieces of granite weights. The cuts on the marble/granite are at a sharp 90 degrees which comes in handy when gluing walls together.

I hope this comes in handy for some of you folks reading this. On a side note, always buy your #11 blades in the 100 count boxes. Until next time, remember, "model railroaders do it all night long!"


