

Union Pacific Maintenance of Way By Erik Lewis

Erik Lewis is an Industry and Public Projects manager for Union Pacific Railroad covering Texas, Louisiana, Tennessee and system Customs and Border Protection projects. In his almost 12 year tenure with Union Pacific, Erik has served in multiple roles in the company's Engineering Department. These roles include track laborer, thermite welder, tie gang foreman and relief Track Inspector prior before entering his current role.

In his current role, Erik oversees a team of consultants who work to manage the railroad portion of federal, state and locally funded projects that impact railroad operations. These range from projects for atgrade road crossings, grade separation projects, Corps of Engineers projects and other special projects as assigned; projects that require Erik to work closely with track, signal and construction forces. One such special project was the delivery and donation of the UP 4141 locomotive to the George H.W. Bush Presidential Library and Museum.

In his spare time, Erik enjoys reading, writing, drawing and spending time with his fiancé Mandy and their labradoodle Tucker.

From Dream to Reality By Gary Ray

Gary is a retired elementary school teacher and has taught grades K through 5. His love of railroads started at age 5 when his parents enrolled him in a private kindergarten in Tucson, Az. Gary loved watching the train set they had at school. Growing up in Los Angeles in the 1950's, he enjoyed seeing trains at Travel Town Museum and the scale railroad at the Pomona fairgrounds. Of course, riding trains at Knott's Berry Farm and Disneyland were special treats. About the same time in 1955 Gary had his name drawn to appear on the Engineer Bill children's show in L.A. The studio sent a model to him to build to run on the set's layout.

Gary has had several Layouts in his life: a fold down American Flyer his dad built, a Tyco and Mantua layout in 1956, a large 28'x32' railroad with an 8 loop helix (not completed to functional level), a large 24'x60' mushroom layout with 550' of mainline that eventually had an operating crew of around 10 circa 1984 and is now building a layout at his home in Azle, TX.

He has been an NMRA member for around 40 years and a member of the LDSIG and OPSIG almost from the beginning. He created and edited the quarterly 30 page PCR Sierra Division newsletter for 5 years and served as Contest Chair for about 10 years. His other hobby is photography and won Best of Show at the 2019 PCR convention.

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Sue Line Railroad

The Sue Line railroad is a HO proto-lance RR by the Late Dr. Richard Kamm of Blanchard, LA (NW suburb of Shreveport). The railroad was named after his ex-wife and coincidently the name of his second bride and companion for the rest of his life (both named Sue). It occupies roughly 48' x 42' and has approximately 500 feet of mainline. Timewise, it is around 30 minutes to get your train from one side to the other.

The layout is DCC with Wi-Throttle control and is fully signaled under CTC dispatcher control (Thank you David Colvin). Two-way radios are used for communication to negotiate track rights. It is fully scenic with long and short trains and plenty of choices ranging from switching galore to no switching at all.

The railroad continues to operate every Thursday due to a dedicated crew willing to host up to 15 operators from any skill level. I can only strive to be as welcoming as this crew is. Freight is carried by The Sue Line, the Louisiana, Arkansas, Texas & Eastern and the CSX railroads across Louisiana from Alexandria to Shreveport. The trains I operated ran flawlessly.

I recently had the privilege to operate on the layout. Speed Muller (thanks again) negotiated a quick Saturday trip to Blanchard. I got up at 5am to rendezvous at Speed's by 6:30am. 6 hours on our feet moving trains (not including the two breaks – one with a tasty lunch provided by the crew) and I was home by midnight! We did make one small detour to visit another layout. Should you be willing, you might just have a wonderful time like I did.



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



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Cowcatcher Division

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Effective March 31, 2020, in accordance with the policy adopted by the National Model Railroad Association (NMRA) at its board meeting on March 7, 2020, Division 1 of the Lone Star Region of the NMRA, commonly known as the "Cowcatcher Division", will require anyone under the age of 18, wishing to attend any division event, to be personally escorted by their parent or legal guardian. Additionally, the parent or legal guardian must sign a current document stating that they will remain in visual contact with their minor at all times.



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
