#### From the fditor

Thanksgiving week I was coerced by a friend to go over to Cleburne with promises that I would like what I saw. We pulled up to a yellow building at the corner of N. Anglin and Brown Streets. I seemed to remember the building as a funeral home at one point, I may be wrong.

The sign on the side of the building read Dillon Depot and a railroad crossbuck was out in front. Now this got my interest up. We walked in the building and the lady who greeted us pointed the trains were to the left and the antiques were to the right. Still thinking this was a hobby shop we walked into a huge room with a large layout taking up the center of the room and pictures, memorabilia adorning the walls. In the back was an O gauge layout under construction and a smaller layout with those ceramic buildings we see most often at Christmas.

The layout was at one time owned by Dr. Randy Bulter, a professor at Southwestern Adventist University teaching criminal justice. The Dillon Depot acquired most of the layout and installed it in the main room.

Everywhere you look there are interesting things to look at. Several other rooms hold antiques, another HO layout under construction, military memorabilia, and my two favorite things, an oldfashioned soda shop and a working player piano! The soda shop sells homemade ice cream made right there, try the strawberry and peach. They sell a reportedly famous chili cheese dog with fixings made from a local family recipe that looks scrumptious. The ice cream choices include some for lactose intolerant people and even people on a vegan diet.



For those who can't keep their hands off things there is a steam whistle, bells and horns they can operate. One of the memorabilia items caught my eye as I had never seen a real railroad post office mailbag. There it was hanging on the wall, amidst other items.

The Dillon Depot is a great place to take the family with something for just about everyone. Or go yourself so you can browse on your own timetable. This is a relatively new gem not too far away. Admission is free and they are open from noon to 8:00 pm every day. The address is 302 North Anglin in downtown Cleburne. This is a different attraction from the Cleburne railroad museum.

Effective March 31, 2020, in accordance with the policy adopted by the National Model Railroad Association (NMRA) at its board meeting on March 7, 2020, Division 1 of the Lone Star Region of the NMRA, commonly known as the "Cowcatcher Division", will require anyone under the age of 18, wishing to attend any division event, to be personally escorted by their parent or legal guardian. Additionally, the parent or legal guardian must sign a current document stating that they will remain in visual contact with their minor at all times.
