



with Joe Fugate

Joe Fugate is the founder, publisher, and editor of Model Railroad Hobbyist (MRH) magazine, first published in January 2009. Joe's been a model railroader since the late 1960s and is a published model railroad author. Joe has a rich background in web software development, publishing, and video production – Model Railroad Hobbyist is just the latest of his hobby media projects.

Joe's HO Siskiyou Line layout, a pioneering mushroom benchwork configuration, was first discussed in depth by Joe in the January and February 1997 issues of Model Railroader magazine. Joe's also helped popularize the use of auto taillight bulbs for short management on DCC layouts.

Model Railroad Hobbyist is a free, online, digital magazine published monthly. The magazine's website includes the MRH Forum that offers a place for model railroaders to meet and talk about their hobby activities. MRH reports that it has about 30,000 subscribers." Advertise with MRH!"



How I Got Coaxed Into Building a Free-moN Module for the Operations Roadshow at National Convention by David Hager

I had heard of the Free-moN meet in Evanston, Wyoming from several people. It sounded amazing to me. It took about 8 hours to make the complete loop. I had also listened to Gordy Robinson talk about the virtues of Free-moN. Looking at the layout from Evanston 2021, my thought was that there was a definite lack of yards for doing operations. I started asking questions about what would be needed in a yard for an event like Evanston: how many mainlines should feed it to keep it busy? how many yard tracks? how big? Do I want to build Free-moN modules?

After some thought, I started with Englewood yard in Houston pre-hump era. Here is the initial plan with an alternate placing of the engine facilities:




It was pointed out to me that it's really big! And after some time and calculations I realized, "it's rather expensive too." So where to go from here?

Well, here is the modification that was arrived to by me with Speed's consultation:



It has a through mainline, two A/D tracks, five yard tracks, an engine facility/yard, a freight depot, a passenger depot and an interchange. I was happy with it. It was seven sections and the yard lead was almost a second mainline. I even added one spur for some sort of industry. It resembled a scaled down Englewood. Word of caution here, be careful what you share with Speed or Gordy. It turns out there are MANY chat groups out there. Quite a few are by invite only. Suddenly, I have invites to a couple of them – all related to Free-moN modules and building a Free-moN yard. One was for the operations roadshow layout at the NMRA 2023 National Convention. Speed had posted it to those guys and asked if I could be invited into the discussion group. The next thing I know I am committed to helping get a yard built for the convention. A short time later, Speed and I are to build the yard with some of the guys helping by supply some things like turnouts and legs and whatnot. The interchange has been removed for the convention module as well as the freight depot, passenger depot and engine facility (although a future expansion turnout is included for the engine shop & yard).


Meanwhile, Speed worked a onetime wholesale deal with Jeff Rykiel to build benchwork modules and asked if I wanted any. What do you do? Well, what I said was, "yes, 2 please". It was a good deal. Maybe a week later, the gentleman drawing up the layout for the convention, Lee Calkins, asked if anyone was bringing a union station passenger depot. I have drawn up the Santa Fe depot for Texas western in HO for 3D printing and am just waiting on a motherboard for my printer (which arrived while I was in Galveston last week and I just now found). That would be easy enough in N scale. I also have Galveston Union Station almost done drawing up. I had not decided on a plan for my 2 modules, so I picked one of the two - Galveston. It would be prototypical and a sample of what my home layout will be. I figured I could use the experience. So, I volunteered to build and bring it. Only one of my modules was completed by Jeff and I asked if he could modify the others and I would pay the additional costs.

Effective March 31, 2020, in accordance with the policy adopted by the National Model Railroad Association (NMRA) at its board meeting on March 7, 2020, Division 1 of the Lone Star Region of the NMRA, commonly known as the "Cowcatcher Division", will require anyone under the age of 18, wishing to attend any division event, to be personally escorted by their parent or legal guardian. Additionally, the parent or legal guardian must sign a current document stating that they will remain in visual contact with their minor at all times.
