



The 80/20 rule or Pareto Principle is used in business to explain that 80% of sales comes from 20% of the customers or 80% of the of a product cost usually comes from 20% of the inputs. The Humble Hot Dog

Hot dogs are sausages, which have been eaten for thousands of years, supposedly as early as 700 B.C. In the late 18th and early 19th century, German immigrants brought their love of sausages to the U.S. Two varieties — wieners (Vienna sausages) and frankfurters (franks) — ultimately were dubbed "hot dogs." Can you guess which German city was the origin of each?

Where the name hot dog came from is unclear, with many cities claiming to be the source of the name. Bruce Kraig, a historian who wrote <u>Hot Dog: A Global History</u>, wrote that the term hot dog came from the association of this type of sausage with dogs grew out of a longstanding joke that the inexpensive and often-hard-to-recognize meat in sausages came from dogs.



Kraig adds fuel to this burning question by relating that Septimius Winner (1827-1902), a songwriter released a song set to a traditional German folk tune known popularly as "Oh Where, Oh Where Has My Little Dog Gone?" The highly tongue-incheek song is sung in an exaggerated German accent and written from the perspective of a mournful dog owner whose dog has been put through the sausage machine of a local butcher



Another source attributes the name hot dog to another German import, the wiener dog. Dachshunds dogs are the lovable long-bodied breed native to Germany, but soon the name also became synonymous with sausages. Some say that the name caught on as a joke. Others claim that in a cold 1901 April day, New York Journal cartoonist Tad Dorgan observed hot dog vendors selling their wares from their carts and, unsure of how to spell dachshund, opted for the simpler 'dog'. Coupled with a matching cartoon in what was the times' most viral form of media spread, the name quickly became mainstream.

Will we ever know? Regardless, enjoy your hot dogs after the June meeting.

Did you know?

- Americans spend more than \$3 billion dollars a year on hot dogs.
- July 18th is national hot dog day. On that day in 2018, Amtrak served Hebrew National hot dogs aboard all their trains.

Effective March 31, 2020, in accordance with the policy adopted by the National Model Railroad Association (NMRA) at its board meeting on March 7, 2020, Division 1 of the Lone Star Region of the NMRA, commonly known as the "Cowcatcher Division", will require anyone under the age of 18, wishing to attend any division event, to be personally escorted by their parent or legal guardian. Additionally, the parent or legal guardian must sign a current document stating that they will remain in visual contact with their minor at all times.
