July's clinic will be a presentation by Mike Ross on some ideas on making trees from several different materials available in the hobby shops. Mike's clinic has information for the novice modeler through the most experienced. He recently gave a preview at Model Railroad Crossing and will be doing the full clinic at the NMRA National in August.

Jim Ogden has this to say about Mike Ross: A must-see railroad at this August's NMRA National convention is Mike Ross's O Scale Virginian Railway. As anyone who has traveled through Virginia and West Virginia knows, any model railroad set in that region needs many realistic deciduous trees. Mike will share his techniques for building trees quickly, cheaply, and capturing the distinctive feel of an eastern hardwood forest in autumn.

His layout features dramatic vistas of coal trains snaking from the coal mines to the east. Expect to see varied motive power (not just steam) and the railroad operates on the premise that the 1959 merger with N&W did not occur. So, do not be surprised to see stack trains in the timeless Virginian paint scheme.


2023 Texas Express, the NMRA National Convention is fast approaching and the convention committee is putting together the final details. Be sure to register at 2023texasexpress.com.

Division One of the Lone Star NMRA Region

Effective March 31, 2020, in accordance with the policy adopted by the National Model Railroad Association (NMRA) at its board meeting on March 7, 2020, Division 1 of the Lone Star Region of the NMRA, commonly known as the "Cowcatcher Division", will require anyone under the age of 18, wishing to attend any division event, to be personally escorted by their parent or legal guardian. Additionally, the parent or legal guardian must sign a current document stating that they will remain in visual contact with their minor at all times.
