





OPERATONS ON THE LEE SUB PART 1 "AN INTROUCTION" By BOB MANGRUM MMR 456

Well, the initial transition from one newsletter editor to another has been successfully navigated and now as we undertake to start a discussion of the operating schemes of my Lee Subdivision of my proto free-lance Texas and Southern Railroad an introduction is in order.

Like a great many of the membership of the NMRA, I was introduced to model railroading at an early age, receiving my first train set at my first Christmas in December 1948 when I was 7 months old! Obviously, it would be a few years before I really understood what was so fascinating about electric trains.

My father was a master machinist and modeler in his own right and by the time I was nine he had built a small shelf layout,


primarily to test his scratch-built HO brass steam locos. (I still have several of these locos which still run in DC.) At that time, I became fascinated with the daily operations of the railroad, a passion I still retain. A relocation because of my dad's job change led to a new layout, the traditional 4 x 8 in my bedroom; this was eventually followed by a third shelf layout which would claim half of my parents' two car garage. In the late 1950s and early 1960s we used TruScale wooden roadbed, with my dad and I hand laying not only the track but Daddy scratch building his switches as well. The amount of trackage laid, as well as the amount of rolling stock available to the railroad, was limited as a result. Then I reached the teenage years with subsequent competition from other interests as I entered high school. After high school graduation, I left home to attend college; when I returned home that first Thanksgiving, my garage layout was dismantled and all the buildings etc. were

packed away. My dad said, "you're in college and interested in girls and cars now."

That ushered in the armchair model railroader era which lasted thru active duty with the army, graduate school, courtship and two relocations as I advanced in the college faculty ranks. As a university professor of American history, my professional interest and my modeling interests have dovetailed nicely. Finally, with the purchase of our first house, management deeded the one car garage area for my sixth layout, an around the perimeter shelf layout.

Solving the myriad construction problems associated with that layout prepared me for the next house with a two-car garage! As we only had one automobile, it was reasonable to develop half of the two-car garage for the seventh version of the Texas and Southern, a proto-free-lance class one railroad set in 1966 which connected

Kansas City and Corpus Christi. I model a portion of the Lee Subdivision with two staging yards, one representing a track to the north (Wichita Falls-Kansas City) and one representing track to the south (Temple-Corpus Christi). The main city and freight yard is in Lee, along with loco service facilities.



Subsequently, a car port was built and the second half of the two-car garage saw the construction of a small Texas & Pacific Railroad yard and industries in Lee.

Connected to the main layout by an interchange track and connections to a staging yard representing both Ft Worth and Big Spring, the addition provides full time

work for a T&P yard master during an op session.

Born in Abilene, Texas I grew up in Richardson, Texas, I am married to Cheryl Everett of Lake Mississippi. My sister, brother-in-law and nephew live in Allen and are members of Division 3.

Next month we will trace the history of the Texas and Southern Railroad. Until then I hope you have only Green Boards and no hot boxes on your run.
